# Message from Rev. Melissa Jo Shin Opel

This week Becca and I were driving and this giant sticker caught my attention. It said, "We are hope despite the times." Something about it was familiar so I snapped a picture and later looked it up. The line is a lyric from an R.E.M. song called "These Days." The chorus goes like this,

"All the people gather

Fly to carry each his burden, we are young despite the years

We are concerned, we are hope despite the times All of a sudden, these days, happy throngs, take this joy

Wherever, wherever you go"

As Jodo Shinshu Buddhists, we focus much of our practice on gratitude for all the ways we are supported, loved and cared for and more importantly the embrace we are held in from the call of Amida Buddha.

Because of this, like Shinran Shonin, we can say, "how joyous I am!" I have been given enough and who I am is enough. We encounter the suffering of others



each day and even though we have enough and are enough, we are aware of our human limitations. But we can practically understand that this is part of the life we live. When we have this deep awareness, not only can we feel hope, we can give hope to others hope that suffering is not the only way to experience life. I think these lyrics can be sung by every generation before us and every generation after because suffering is part of the human condition. It is important we share our lives with others so that they too may come to know the joy in our hearts and the hope despite the times.



Honoring Mrs. Tamiko Yasuhara who represents the ladies of the BCSF Fujinkai and BWA who created & continue to perpetuate best-selling BCSF Bazaar recipes.

With gratitute to:

- \* The late Mrs. Estuko Kai who originated BCSF's famous fried chicken;
- \* The late Emiko Kuruma and Mrs. Tami Yasuhara who together perfected the BCSF tare (teriyaki sauce) sauce that makes the BCSF fried chicken so unique and delicious; and
- \* Past and present members of the Senior and Junior Fujinkai and BWA for their kitchen skills, dedication and hard work they do on behalf of the BCSF.



Mrs. Tamiko Yasuhara joined BCSF as a young bride after the war. She brought her three children -- Stanley, Susan and Kenneth, along with Doug Dorn -- to church. Mrs. Yasuhara was a member of the Jr. Fujinkai and also a Cub Scout Den Mother. If

there had been a choir at that time, she would have been there singing with them.

Mrs. Yasuhara is most famous for her role with the late Emiko Kuruma in perfecting the BCSF tare sauce. She was head chef for various Bazaar dishes such as hand-made pork gyoza and tsukemono.

The late Mrs. Etsuko Kai created the BCSF teriyaki fried chicken. Our chicken is unique: it is fried then coated with the tare sauce and baked. It is a labor-intensive process that results in mighty tasty chicken!

BCSF's 80th-anniversary (1898-1978) book states: "The Junior Fujinkai uses the lower kitchen to prepare their famous 'Fujinkai chicken.' This delicious chicken cooked to perfection following a secret, time- and palate-tested recipe, has been a best-seller at the Food Bazaar since it was first introduced a number of years ago. Numerous cooking processes convert the lowly chicken in a gastronomic delight revered by all who have ever tasted it."

BCSF has not made the famous fried chicken since 2020, but with enough helpers, we can hope to bring it back in the future.

AED is the Automated External Defibrillator used in cardiac arrest emergencies. BCSF has two AEDs, one in the lobby and one in the gym.

CPR is Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, a lifesaving technique to use when someone's breathing or heartbeat has stopped.



BCSF members Donna Kotake and Joyce Nakamura wish to invite you to the 50th Anniversary of CANE (Committee Against Nihonmachi Eviction), an event "Celebrating Activism & Community," on August 19, 2023, 2:00-5:00 pm, JCCCNC, 1840 Sutter Street, San Francisco.

CANE was a multi-generational, multi-racial grassroots organization that fought for the rights of the residents and small businesses threatened by eviction at the hands of the Redevelopment Agency. It worked to preserve San Francisco Japantown as a residential and small business community, and to remain a center for the Japanese American community. BCSF hosted many CANE programs in the 1970s. The late BCSF member Guy Ono was the first President of CANE.
